Communication: Are We Disconnected From Our Patients?

Think of the way the world has changed since the 1920's; space stations, color television, the wireless generation. The youth of today, only know wireless and are often very skilled at a young age in the use of these devices.

Electronic medical records, cell phones, face time or any of the many communication devices of today have changed the way we communicate. We can bank and pay bills on-line. Prescriptions go directly to the pharmacy. To borrow an old commercial phrase, we “reach out and touch people” in new ways. Has the cost been the lost art of communication? Has this caused low patient satisfaction scores?

Do we look up at our patients while we enter their information into the computer? Are we so busy entering data, we forget to hold a hand, smile or acknowledge the patient or their family? Do we scurry out of the room or cubicle without asking if there is something else they need? As they sit on stretchers in pre-op waiting to go into surgery, do we check on them after we admit them? Hourly rounding by nurses to inquire on their well being improves patient satisfaction scores and decreases call light use.

Just as there is a generation gap in nursing, there are patient generation gaps. Our elderly grew up with party lines, rotary phones, radio, black and white television and the written word. That generation has either embraced the new electronic world or they don't use it at all. Think of the way the world has changed since the 1920's; space stations, color television, the wireless generation. The youth of today, only know wireless and are often very skilled at a young age in the use of these devices.

Heather Ead in the June article in *JOPAN* gives the following tips for improving the patient experience:

1. Include the patient when giving hand-off report. “Mr. S. I am going to give the nurse an update on your recovery.” This gives a partnered approach to patient care and avoids an assembly line feeling.
2. Seek agreement with the patient during the verbal report. “Mr. S is allergic to PCN, isn't that correct Mr. S?”
3. When responding to alarms, assure the patient that nothing serious is going on and what the nature of the alarm is.
4. Be mindful of conversations over an apparently unconscious patient; a patient with closed eyes may have awareness of their surroundings and excellent hearing.
5. Assess the patient for anxiety with your pain assessment. Anxiety interferes with your ability to control pain and nausea.
6. Consider environmental factors on anxiety and pain: cold, noise, lights, smells, lack of privacy and chaos. Control what you can to provide comfort to the patient.
7. Remember to pause and provide eye contact or hold a hand.
8. Have the patient repeat key education facts. “So Mr. S, when are your restart-

ing the Coumadin?” (*JOPAN*)

No matter what area of perianesthesia nursing you work in, you meet patients and families. Don't forget to introduce yourself, smile, hold a hand and be sincere. “Hi, I am Barb Ochampaugh, I will be your nurse today.”

Safe Staffing in NYS

Having recently started working in a hospital in the midst of union negotiations, I find the “Safe Staffing for Quality Care Act” to be a point of particular concern. Those of you out there who are in a NYSNA (New York State Nurses Association) shop know that there can be some discord between the union and administration. Staffing plans are created and “implemented”, though those working the floor may beg to differ. Seasoned nurses who have loyalty to a certain facility may be forced to “hospital shop” to find better conditions in some cases. This also affects our classically trained nursing school veterans who have had their RN’s and have no desire after 30-some-odd years to fork over money and time to “go back to school”. In a system where they were grandfathered in to maintain their RN without a BSN, switching to a new facility will be nearly impossible without a bachelor’s degree. In my opinion, experience and Evidence Based Practice most often trump a bachelor’s degree from a university who probably has a shortage of clinical instructors and limited access to critical care and ER rotations for their students.

What is being done?

On April 16th, NYSNA hosted a picketing event in NYC with thousands of supporters in support of the Safe Staffing Act. On local levels, some hospitals are proposing strikes to enforce the conditions of the bill (ref: Bill A6571-2013), but legislatively, the last action or amendment made on the bill was one year ago and it has not yet been passed. The bill proposes to mandate compliance with staffing plans and to ensure appropriate care to each patient. For example, an L&D nurse should not be floated to the ICU. To ensure that each patient gets the care he or she needs and that our nurses can work in a somewhat controlled environment, things do need to change in New York. 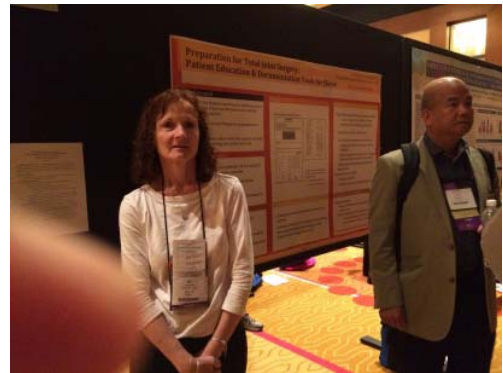


Shining Star Award
